6. BOAT SAILING.

In an anything-but-uneventful commission we have been fortunate in having two periods during which a large amount of sailing took place. We refer to the periods of practice for the two Fleet Sailing Regattas.

The Squadron returned to Bermuda at the end of March, 1938. From then until the Sailing Regatta, which was held on 4th and 5th June, we put in an intensive amount of practice. Up to 3rd May, practice was held on make-and-mend days only, but from then on a practice race was held on every day possible, only gales and exercise periods being allowed to interfere.

For the Ratings' Race we had six entries for the cutters, the same number for whalers and three for the gig. Eliminating Races were therefore held to discover the best coxswains for cutters and whalers. The resultswere:—

As we only carry one gig, the Sailing Secretary (Lt. Cdr. Hope) went away with each aspirant in turn to discover their respective merits. He chose Petty Officer Scott, the runners-up being Able Seaman (now Leading Seaman) Hambly and Able Seaman Yeo.

It says much for the keenness of coxswains and their crews, in the face of other attractive sporting events and of the lure of the make-and-mend "caulk," that there were not many days on which all five boats were not away practising—all in their own spare time. It was very noticeable that few boats were away practising from other ships, except during the weekly Fleet Practice Races on Saturdays.

In the Sailing Regatta itself, all races except the Warrant Officers' Race were team events, in which the first boat home scored 20 points, the second 19 points, third 18 points—and so on. The ship scoring the highest total with her first four boats home was to win the Challenge Cup for the race.

The course was twice round a 4½ mile triangular course in the Great Sound, starting and finishing at Parsonage Beacon.

The last-minute absence of "AJAX," at Jamaica on account of riots, was unfortunate, as we knew that they were very keen and had some good coxswains.

"APOLLO" having left the station in May, the only ships to take part in the Regatta were "YORK," EXETER" and "ORION."

As the race was decided on the first round, half the handicap times were subtracted from the finishing times of gigs and cutters.

The results speak for themselves and show what hard practice and good team work can do. Midshipman Woolrych and Petty Officer Scott each sailed very fine races. Our gig's sails were found to have considerably less area than those of the other ships' gigs. Had they been of equal size, Petty Officer Scott would probably have won his race.

Before the 1939 Sailing Regatta we had considerably less time available for practice. The Squadron did not return to Bermuda until 11th March and the Regatta was held on 19th and 20th April. Again, we held practice races on every possible day. As time was so limited, it was decided not to hold Eliminating Races to decide on Coxswains, but that boats should be sailed by the same rating coxswains as the previous year, subject to the proviso

that each coxswain could be challenged and, if so, races would be held to see who was the better man, the winner sailing the boat in the Regatta. One or two challenges were received, but the challengers were unsuccessful.

We managed to obtain a new set of sails for the gig, which greatly improved her performance.

An intensive programme of other sporting events made it difficult for coxswains to obtain crews, but nevertheless the amount of practice put in was considerable. Our previous year's sweeping success, however, had made us a bit over-confident and, also, other ships' boats put in a lot more practice than in 1938.

Our results were therefore not so good. The course and point system were as for 1938, except that only the first three boats home counted points for their ship, as "Berwick" had no gig.

8. A LINK WITH THE PAST.

'The following inscription has been copied from a memorial tablet in Kingston Parish Church, Jamaica—evidence in itself that "Orion's " associations with the place are not all of recent date.

"Near this spot in the adjoining Cemetery are deposited the remains of "Edward Baker," Midshipman in the Royal Navy of Great Britain, Second son of William

Baker, of Badfordbury in the County of Herford, By Sophia, third daughter of John Convers, Late of Copped Hall in the County of Essex. A youth, whose rare Endowment by nature, improved by Education, and confirmed by the Instructions of his Commander, Commodore John Thomas Duckworth, gave the fairest promise to his Country (had it pleased the Almighty to spare his life) of a distinguished Christian Hero, and a truly Valuable Man, Initiated in the profession of his choice with these Advantages, he served on Board the Orion in the memorable Action of the 1st of June 1794, and shared with Singular merit, in the Glories of that important Day-with equal Gallantry, but less propitious Fortune under the same respectable officer, on the 21st of March, 1796, he was engaged in the Attack made by the Leviathan and Africa on the Forts of Leogane, in the Island of St. Domingo, but yielding Alas! to the fatigues of that disastrous Service, succeeded by the prevailing Malady of the Climate, he closed a brilliant Career of Honour and Virtue in the 17th year of his age.

So hard, indeed, his lot, and premature his fall, deprived in that awful moment, of the consoling care of his dearest Relatives—Yet happy at least in this, that, with Faculties unimpaired and hopeful of the Bliss which awaited him, he breathed his Last in the Arms of his Protector, and Friend, and was attended to the Grave by the Unfeigned Tears, the heartfelt Sighs, of the Companions of his Naval Fortunes:—

The zealous Admirers of his Excellence and Character-
